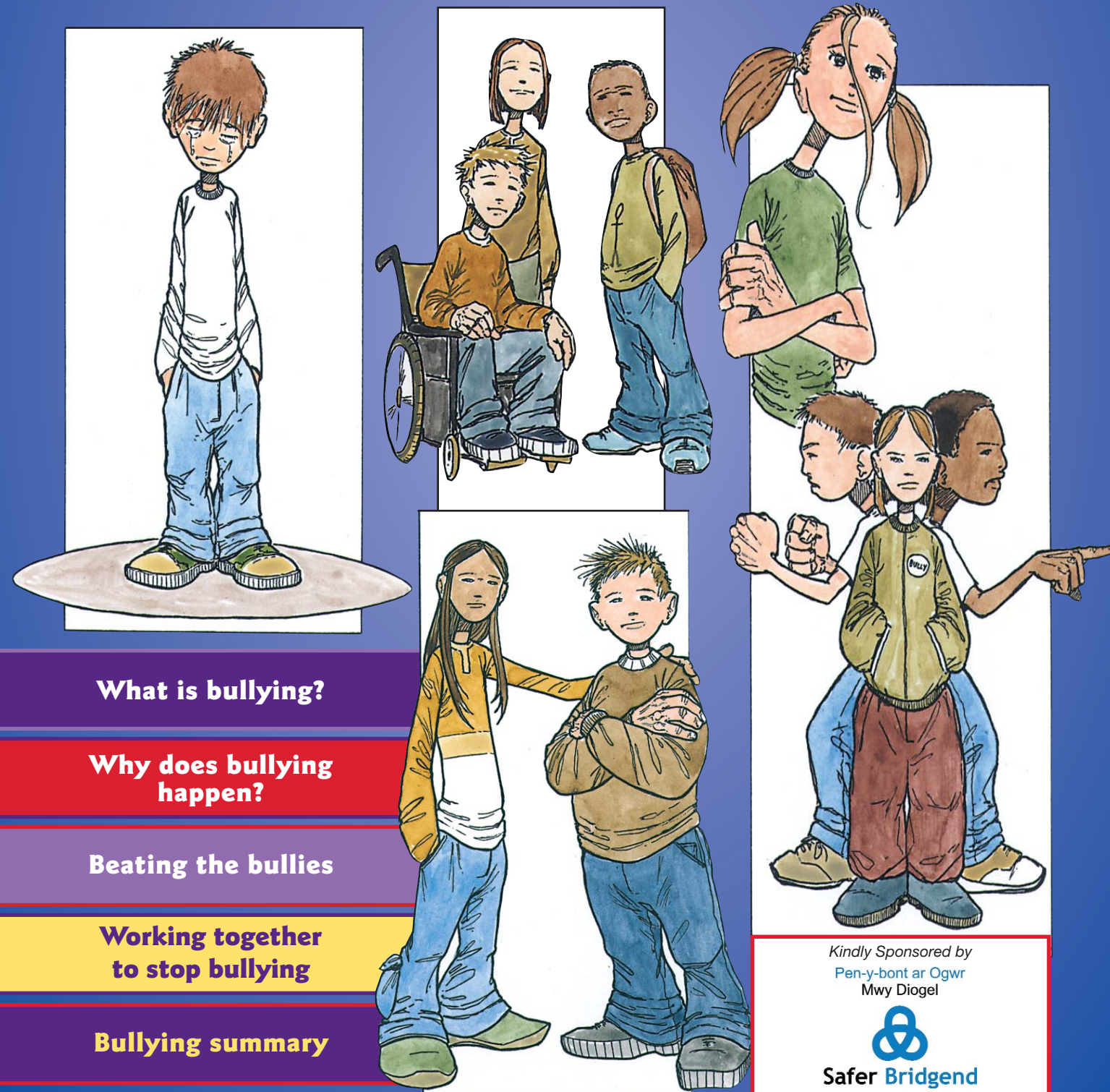

Youth Works in Bridgend

The essence of the Youth Works model is partnership and this has been key to its success. Partners in Bridgend include the Bridgend Community Safety Partnership (Safer Bridgend), Youth Offending Team, Bridgend Community Education's Youth Service, South Wales Police, Groundwork Bridgend & Neath Port Talbot, Valleys to Coast Housing Association and local drugs awareness and sports development agencies.

Partnership is at the heart of the organisation encompassing the strengths and experience of the local multi agency steering group, which comprises of senior representatives from the private and voluntary sectors. The project responds to needs identified by local people by drawing together a multi-agency partnership which can then support youth and community initiatives which meet those needs.

Youth Works makes an important contribution to addressing anti-social behaviour by delivering the following tangible outcomes for young people and communities:

- Structured and vibrant programmes and activities to provide the young people with the skills, capacity and motivation to become directly involved in their personal development and the regeneration of their local community.
- Improved opportunities allow young people to fulfil their potential and reduce the risk of offending behaviour.
- Enhanced employment opportunities through access to training and educational activities.
- Improvements to the local environment adding to the quality of life of young people and all residents.
- Increased opportunities for young people and older residents to take part in decision taking in their lives and become stakeholders in their communities. The whole community benefits from reductions in crime rates, youth nuisance and the fear of crime.

Project activities fall into five main categories:

- Preventative Work
- Diversionary Work
- Skills Development
- Remedial Work
- Community Capacity Building

Youth Works projects aim to:-

- Provide young people in the 8-25 age range with opportunities to develop their potential in and around their neighbourhood with a view to reducing risk factors associated with youth offending.
- Build capacity of the local community to offer its young people a better start to their adult lives.
- Provide new community facilities and physical improvements to the neighbourhood involving local people both young and young-at-heart.

The Youth Works programme in Bridgend has since been recognised by its present agency partners for its valuable contribution in alleviating the problems of young people growing up in disadvantaged areas through crime reduction, social well being, informal and alternative education and community regeneration.

The programme has been strongly supported by the Community Safety Partnership as their alternative to the Young Inclusion Programme in the Bridgend area due to the numerous outcomes for young people shared with the governments Prevent & Deter Strategy.
